Finding Comfort and Joy in a World of Strife

In the familiar Christmas carol "God Rest Ye Merry, Gentlemen," there's a refrain that echoes deeply through centuries of holiday celebrations: "O tidings of comfort and joy." This simple yet profound line offers a message of peace, hope, and joy. But in a world often filled with strife, war, division, and political turmoil, how can we truly find comfort and joy? Is this message still relevant today?

The carol was written in a time of unrest—during the late 16th century, when England was plagued by political and religious conflict. As the psalmist declares in Psalm 16:11, "In Your presence there is fullness of joy."

As we enter the holiday season, let us hold onto this ancient message: "O tidings of comfort and joy." These words remind us that no matter what we face, God offers comfort in the midst of our struggles and joy that is not bound by the world's divisions. In the darkness of winter, let us remember the light of Christ that shines in us, bringing peace and joy to all people, even in the most trying times.

November 2024 Session Meetings Highlights

The Deacons cyber security and elder fraud event on October 29 had 36 participants. Thank you to the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department for an excellent presentation. The annual Service of Solace will be held on December 1, coordinated by Melody Edwards Becker.

Pastor David reported that the Men's and Women's Bible Studies are both going strong. The Advent sermon series will be "Hymns for the Holidays," and Pastor David has sermons planned through August 2025.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) is planning for Advent. Advent devotionals have arrived. Saturday, November 30 is Church decorating beginning at 9:00 a.m. New banners have been installed in the Sanctuary. The Bell Choir has two new members and the Chancel Choir is looking for new singers. Christmas Eve services are being planned for 4, 6 and 10 p.m. Sundays December 29 and January 5 will have only one service at 10:00 a.m.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that the November 1 Salute to Veterans dinner was a "wonderful evening" which include candle lighting for deceased members and assistance from the Boy Scouts. MVPC provided Olive Crest with 110 Thanksgiving food boxes and \$2,600 in gift cards, and Operation Christmas Child with 180 shoeboxes filled with gifts. The Pet Ministry is scheduling its annual bake sale for Sunday, February 9, 2025. Project 150 volunteers helped assemble 2,500 food boxes for Thanksgiving and will assist in assembling 2,500 Christmas boxes. Session approved repairs to the Coffee Shop counters required as a result of a malfunctioning coffee brewer (a gift was received to help purchase a new brewer). The next Commission meeting is January 16, 2025 (with 3 new members).

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that Women's Bible study completed its study of the Book of Ephesians and will begin on Advent. The Women's Christmas Tea and Brunch will be on December 7. Christmas caroling to homes of shut-in members is scheduled for December 15. The Coffee Shop will offer free beverages on Sunday, December 1 to celebrate Advent. The Just Us widows' group enjoyed making Christmas crafts on November 19.


The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) reported it now has a crew of seven volunteers helping with Sunday morning fellowship preparation, with the goal of providing fresh baked cookies three Sundays each month.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures) presented financial reports through October. Finance has reviewed the capital reserve study and specifically focused on items needing repairs and/or replacement over the next five years, totaling over \$450,000. Those items include HVAC repairs and replacement, roof repairs, bathroom upgrades and computer equipment replacement. Elder Al Youmans reported that the ceramic tile floors throughout the facilities had been professionally cleaned. The kitchen's reverse osmosis system required some repairs and the heating system boiler required a new igniter.

Gary Wall will be providing ministerial assistance in Fellowship Hall during the fellowship time.

The Compassionate Friends Worldwide Candle Lighting on the 2nd Sunday in December unites family and friends around the globe in lighting candles for one hour to honor the memories of the sons, daughters, brothers, sisters, and grandchildren who left too soon. As candles are lit on December 8th, 2024 at 7:00 pm local time, hundreds of thousands of people commemorate and honor the memory of all children gone too soon.

Now believed to be the largest mass candle lighting on the globe, the annual Worldwide Candle Lighting (WCL), a gift to the bereavement community from The Compassionate Friends, creates a virtual 24-hour wave of light as it moves from time zone to time zone. TCF's WCL started in the United States in 1997 as a small internet observance and has since swelled in numbers as word has spread throughout the world of the remembrance. Hundreds of formal candle lighting events are held, and thousands of informal candle lightings are conducted in homes, as families gather in quiet remembrance of children who have died and will never be foreotten.


The Everyday Advent is a 4-week devotional


