
Sunday, December 22, 2024 Fourth Sunday of Advent 10:00 AM

Often called the visitation, the encounter between Mary and Elizabeth is full of joy, recognition, gratitude, and blessing. But as the women encounter each other, so do Jesus and John the Baptist. God becomes a body in Jesus, and that body will be offered up for the sake of the world. This body, recognized already by John in the womb, will eventually undergo the suffering and shame of death on a cross. Without losing sight of that big picture, today we enter into the up-close picture of Mary and Elizabeth's encounter and share in the joy and gratitude they have in common with all who recognize Christ in their neighbor.




CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE GOSPEL

The Holy Gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

Luke 1:39-55

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb.

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." And Mary said,

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. Please follow the directions of the ushers and use the hand sanitizer provided.


Bread is placed in the hands. Red wine and White grape juice are offered by individual cup.
