

Weekly Messenger 12-27-2024

December 2024 Session Meetings Highlights

Session met on December 17, which is earlier than the usually 4th Wednesday of the month, to avoid conflicts with the Christmas holidays.

Pastor David reported that for services on December 29 and January 5, MVPC will test the use of a digital bulletin accessed by a QR code on people's phones. The order of worship will also be displayed on the projector screens in the Sanctuary and will be available on the MVPC website. The Church Staff Christmas luncheon was held on December 16. Christmas Eve services will be at 4:00 p.m., (contemporary), 6:00 p.m. (traditional) and 10:00 p.m. (communion).

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship). A big thank you to Dian Ward as she ends her service as moderator of the Worship Committee and rotates off the Session. The December 1 Service of Solace was described as a "beautiful service." Thanks the Pet Ministry for providing emotional support dogs for the Service. Advent devotionals were distributed at both services on December 1, the entire order of devotionals being handed out. Sundays December 29 and January 5 will have only one service at 10:00 a.m. The Chancel Choir needs additional singers.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported the Pet Ministry stuffed animal sale on Sunday, December 15 was a great success, selling all the stuffed animals in 30 minutes and netting \$395 for Pet Ministry projects. Dottie Webber will be stepping in to lead the Veterans' Ministry, as Dennis Bunce begins pastoral service at Westminster Presbyterian Church. The Pet Ministry annual bake sale will be on Sunday, February 9, 2025. Collection of Walmart gift cards continues through Sunday, December 22, with distribution during the couple of days before Christmas.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that Christmas caroling to shut-ins on Sunday, December 15 had 25 participants and was a wonderful holiday blessing to the people visited. Christmas caroling at Las Ventanas and to MVPC Sports Minister Rick Strasser on Tuesday, December 17 was similarly very well received and appreciated. Session approved increasing the allocation for repairs to the Coffee Shop counters and cabinetry required as a result of a malfunctioning coffee brewer from \$15,000 to \$17,000 to cover any contingent repair requirements. The Coffee Shop and Book Store will be closed December 29 and January 5. Repairs will take place during that time period. Elder Chris Kirschman reported that the Youth Group, Young Adults, and Sunday School programs are all going well. The Men's Ministry monthly breakfast group collected and donated over \$10,000 for the Westminster Presbyterian Church food bank.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) reported that Elder Tammy Roth oversaw the repairs to the reverse osmosis system servicing the kitchen.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder Al Youmans reported that the cooling tower which is part of the facility's HVAC system had a leak requiring a repair costing approximately \$6,100. The leak caused water damage in the accounting office which will require repairs and mold testing costing \$3,600 - \$4,000.

Jim Camburn, MVPC's insurance guru, provided a written report on the insurance renewal package offered to MVPC for 2025 from the Insurance Board. The package included an approximately 10% increase in the casualty and liability insurance for the facilities with a 5% increase in values of the property covered. Jim noted that the increase was in line with current insurance industry trends. Session approved the package for 2025.

Session approved the Session operations manual for 2025. A Congregational meeting was scheduled for December 29 following the Sunday morning service to elect Elders and Deacons for 2025. The annual Congregational meeting was scheduled for February 16, 2025. Many thanks to Elders Tammy Roth, Dian Ward, Dennis Bunce and Jerry Takier who are completing their terms on Session.

The next Session meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 22, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.




The Fear Dilemma

This series is to inform, educate, and biblically ground what Christian parents should know about fear as well as provide a path forward for family understanding and discussion around how we




should view the issue in the current climate.

Vital Signs How healthy are you?



Pastor J.D. Greear explores the way Jesus taught us to pray and how he approached prayer to his Father.






