These are the opening words from the song, Gratitude, by Brandon Lake, a song that Marilyn sang in worship a few weeks ago. In stark juxtaposition to the hardest struggle our family has ever walked together, this song has filled our home. Marilyn's angiosarcoma diagnosis has hit us hard, but in the face of deep pain, there has been gratitude. Our family would like to express our gratitude for the ways you have, as Bishop Greg Busboom shared when he led worship at Faith on December 15, "lived out your promise to support and pray for your pastor and family." You made this promise when I was installed as your pastor 12 years ago, and you are keeping your promise. To allow us to focus our efforts on what is most important right now, you have taken three burdens off of our shoulders:

- 1. <u>The Burden of Food</u>. That's right, food! Thank you for the many meals you have provided. You have relieved the burden of grocery shopping, meal planning, and cooking to allow us to focus on the love that dwells at our kitchen table.
- 2. The Burden of Work. I imagine many parents walking our walk are faced with the struggle to maintain hours at a job so they still have a job and health benefits. You have shown grace by volunteering to help and giving me the time I need to be with my family for hospital stays, appointments, and just being together.
- 3. <u>The Burden of Finances</u>. Medical care is crazy expensive, but we have felt none of the burden.

So, again, thank you! Thank you for your generosity, for your understanding, for your prayers, and for your love as you live out the promise you made at my installation.





In recognition of the 50th anniversary of ELCA World Hunger, our Central/Southern IL Synod staff have challenged congregations to raise a total of \$10,000. We've accepted the challenge! We will host our own soup supper at **5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 6** (the date of Epiphany) and have an Epiphany sing along with favorites and requests. Thank you to all who participated in our Reverse Advent to provide food for families in and around Jacksonville. We had a wonderful response and will be delivering the bags soon. Thank you to Hallie Mayner for leading this project this year!



JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER

The reaction from Faith Church concerning the annual Christmas Food baskets has been very kind and giving. Over 300 families have signed up for this event. As of this writing, our church has donated 136.4 pounds of foods at the estimated cost by weight equaling \$681.

The Food Center report for November is as follows: 786 families, a total of 1,854 people, were served for food orders at a cost of \$120,245.00, equaling 48,290 pounds. We served 535 families for bakery, a total of 1,191 people at a cost of \$9,085.00, equaling 8,025 pounds. The churches contributed \$24,022.40 in money and \$20,993 in food donations. Faith Church donated \$300 in November.
