#### The Miraculous Feast: A Glimpse into the Heart of Christ

As we continue our adventure into the "signs" of Jesus, in John 6, we encounter one of the most well-known miracles of Jesus – the feeding of the 5,000. But beyond the remarkable multiplication of loaves and fish, this event holds deep lessons that resonate with us today, offering a picture of Christ's compassion, provision, and the deeper meaning of our spiritual hunger.

The scene begins with a large crowd following Jesus, drawn to Him by His healing ministry. As evening approaches, the disciples notice the pressing issue: they are in a remote place, and the people have no food. It's in this moment of apparent scarcity that Jesus shows how He transcends earthly limitations.

The miracle starts with a boy's small offering—five barley loaves and two fish. "What are they among so many?" Andrew, one of the disciples, asks. It's a good question. How could such a small amount meet such a large need? But this is where the beauty of faith and divine provision shines through. Jesus takes the humble offering, blesses it, and it multiplies until there is more than enough to satisfy every person. In fact, after everyone has eaten, twelve baskets of leftovers are collected.

What can we learn from this? First, we are reminded that no offering is too small for God. In our lives, we often feel that our gifts, talents, or resources are too insignificant to make a difference. But when placed in Jesus' hands, even the smallest offering can be multiplied in ways we cannot fathom.

Next, this miracle points to Jesus as the true Bread of Life. Later in John 6, Jesus tells the crowd, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." The physical food He provides is a symbol of the deeper spiritual nourishment He offers to those who seek Him. Just as the crowds were satisfied by the bread and fish, we find lasting satisfaction in Christ alone.

Lastly, notice the order in which Jesus performs the miracle. He instructs His disciples to have the people sit down in groups, creating an atmosphere of order and anticipation. Jesus doesn't just give; He provides with care and intentionality. He organizes us into His Kingdom, preparing us for something greater.

In a world that often feels fragmented and lacking, the feeding of the 5,000 reminds us of Jesus' ability to provide abundantly, both for our physical and spiritual needs. May we offer our little to Him, trusting that He can do far more than we can imagine.





#### The Book of 1 Corinthians




#### This Is Love

#### **January 2025 Session Meetings Highlights**

Five new Elders were installed on Sunday, January 12: Christy Bernall, Patti Luthy, David Matawitz, John Meola, and Dwight Rickard. Elder Connie Petersen was installed for her second term.

Session accepted, with regrets, the resignation of George Gray as a member of Session.

Pastor David reported that MVPC will host the "I Will Always Love You" Whitney Houston worship service on February 9, featuring Ms. Monet. The MVPC staff will be doing team building training on February 3. The Advent sermon series was well received. Christmas Eve services had approximately 530 attendees.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) is busy scheduling ushers and greeters for 2025. The Commission approved and reported to Session on a program to enhance the Chancel Choir by bringing in lead singers for each section – soprano, alto, tenor and bass. The Commission noted similar programs were used by Green Valley and Grace Presbyterian Churches. Session approved the program on a trial basis through June.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that a donation of \$2,000 had been made to Presbyterian Disaster Relief earmarked for assistance to victims of the Southern California fires. Session approved a special offering on February 16 to benefit Southern California fire victims. The next homeless bags assembly will be on February 16. The Pet Ministry donate \$300.00 to the Pasadena Humane Society Eaton Fire Relief Effort from the proceeds of its stuffed animal sale. The Pet Ministry bake sale is scheduled for February 9. Collection of hygiene products for Project 150 will take place on January 26. Family Promise is expected to hold a ribbon cutting ceremony for its new facility sometime in April.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that the Coffee Shop counters and cabinetry repairs were completed and the new (donated) coffee machine was up and running. The Book Store will soon be stocking items for spring. Men's and Women's Ministries remain active. The Men's Ministry monthly breakfast group collects money for the Westminster Presbyterian Church food bank. Women's Bible Study is working on the Book of James while Men's Bible Study is working on the Book of Ephesians. Young Adults will have a bowling outing on January 28.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) will be holding cookie baking on January 31.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). The cold Sanctuary on Sunday, January 19, was the result of an issue with the boiler, which has been repaired.

The annual Congregational meeting was scheduled for February 16, 2025.

The next Session meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 26, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.
