#### LISTENING TOGETHER

Last Sunday, I told a story about my first day of seminary. My classmates and I started our orientation by sharing how each of us had heard God's call in our lives, ultimately leading us to the decision to prepare for ordained ministry. There were some Peters in the group, those who heard God calling them to leave their occupation, drop their nets, and follow. There were a lot of Jonahs, those who heard God calling and promptly ran in the opposite direction. I was a Samuel, one who realized God had been calling me for a long time, but I just hadn't recognized God's voice and needed others to help me discern.

We miss all sorts of things when we aren't listening. We get busy and distracted. We get tired and complacent. Rarely are we sitting on the edge of our seats, ears poised and tuned in (right now I'm in one of those rare situations as I sit in a waiting room with Marilyn at the Siteman Cancer Center in St. Louis, surrounded by people listening intently for their names to be called). Listening requires us to intentionally stop, not just to hear what is going on around us, but to allow our spirit to stir and then respond to the call that is placed upon us.

Our church Council is inviting you to just such an opportunity. We are going to be hosting a **listening session after worship on Sunday, February 23**. The men are offering to give us a taste of the fabulous breakfasts you've been hearing so much about so that growling stomachs don't get in the way of listening ears. We'll gather around tables and reflect on a few questions together such as:

- 1. What is most meaningful to you about being involved in our ministry at Faith Lutheran Church?
- 2. In what ways is our ministry nurturing your faith? What could we do to help further?
- 3. We realize everyone is in a different place in their life's walk (single, married, parents, retired, etc.). In your walk, are you getting the support you need? How can we help? (For example, providing a babysitting night for parents, support group for living with loss/grief, or other life transitions, etc.)
- 4. Here at Faith, we value all generations involved and interacting. In what ways can we do this better? How can you help?

Please make time to join us for this wonderful opportunity to listen together, and in the meantime, reflect on these questions and listen on your own. How might God be speaking to you, calling you, and calling us into a new season of ministry together at Faith Lutheran Church? Let's follow Peter's example with a willingness to let go and follow. Let's follow Samuel's example, allowing others to help us recognize God's voice. Let's follow Jonah's example... wait, maybe not. But, as we commit to listening together, do be on the lookout for big fish with big appetites sent to get us going in the right direction!

### Faith Family Updates

What's new around Faith? Maybe you haven't been here in awhile or you just haven't noticed, but our ministry is constantly changing.

#### ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

On January 26, we held our Annual Meeting. It was a great opportunity to give thanks to God for our ministry in 2024 and rededicate ourselves to God's mission among us for the year to come. Here are a few highlights:

- President Kelly Hartz expressed appreciation to the rest of the Council and congregation for helping through Pastor Adam's sabbatical. Pastor Adam also expressed appreciation for his sabbatical as an opportunity for renewal and perspective through receiving new eyes.
- A question was raised concerning the Faith Scholarship Fund. We do still have a fund for a one-time, \$1,000 scholarship for any member of Faith who is a high school graduate or adult seeking a degree. Applications can be picked up in the church office.
- A desire was expressed for more frequent financial updates. This is something the congregational Council has been discussing through the last year and will continue to discuss at our next meeting. As always, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, and Endowment Fund reports are available in the monthly Council packet on the turnstile by the Total Ministry Center. You can direct questions to any of our Council members (Greg Kimler, Kay Schnitker, Kelly Hartz, Kelly Street, Ken Devlin, Mindy Carlson, Monica Proefrock, and Patty Nelson,) or Treasurers (Barb Davenport and Martha Krohe).
- We approved the withdrawal of \$20,000 from Faith's Endowment Fund to be distributed to local ministries, global ministries, educational ministries, and capital improvements. This money is separate from our annual budget and is held in specific investments that retain the principle and make the capital gains available for disbursement. At the end of 2024, the Endowment Fund had a cost basis of \$316,566 and market value of \$422,345. - A balanced 2025 budget was passed as we commit to support our shared ministry through the spiritual practice of stewardship.
- In the congregational Council meeting after the Annual Meeting, Kelly Street was elected to be our new president and Patty Nelson our new secretary. Many thanks to outgoing president Kelly Hartz, outgoing secretary Kelly Street, and to all of our Council members for their leadership and service.

### TOTAL MINISTRY... A REFRESHER

In the wake of the Covid pandemic, our congregation lost all appetite to serve on committees. There was no willingness to meet monthly to participate in a top-down approach to planning, overseeing, and carrying out programs. In the wake of void this left, Total Ministry was born. It's approach is different from committees as it relies on the Holy Spirit at work in you, nudging and calling you to step forward to participate in various ministry teams or to start a new one. Core teams of Worship, Outreach, and Discipleship meet to assess the strength and effectiveness of ministry in their area, supporting those who are already serving, helping new ministry teams to form, and sharing suggestions with the congregation on new ideas for ministry in the future. The next three pages of our newsletter are dedicated to these areas of ministry – worship, discipleship, and outreach. Look and see what ministry is already happening for you to join, or consider what new ministry you may help start.
