Most Encouraging Chapter in the Bible (Romans 8:1-17, 28-29)

Warmup: What superpower would you like to have to impact your neighborhood?

READ Romans 8

- This chapter discusses life in the Spirit: what are your first memories of someone you observed as "walking with the Spirit, or alive in the Spirit"?
 - What about this person captured your attention?
- Romans 8:1 says, "There is no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus." How does this truth affect your confidence, your faith?
- Have you considered that sin is "hostility toward God?" What ideas can cloud your thinking about your sin being hostile toward God?

Cultural and Historical Background

In the Greco-Roman world, the concept of life (zóé) was often associated with the physical and temporal existence. However, the New Testament writers, particularly John and Paul, infused the term with a deeper theological meaning. They emphasized that true life is found in Christ, contrasting it with the temporary and often unfulfilling life offered by the world. This understanding was revolutionary in a culture that often sought life through philosophy, pleasure, or power.

- Verse 6 explains that the Spirit of God brings life (zóé) and peace. How have you recently experienced victory in your thinking?
 - What patterns of thought tend to erode your peace?
 - Share a few strategies you can use to regain your peace when it starts to slip away.

8:11 And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also **give life** to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

The phrase "give life" is **zóopoieó: to make alive, to give life, to quicken.** This is the life-giving power of God, particularly through the Holy Spirit. This term emphasizes the transformative power of God to bring spiritual life to those who are spiritually dead.
