THE CHOSEN By Pastor Adam

Have any of you seen or heard of the popular series, "The Chosen"? If not, you may need to check your pulse! It has taken television by storm as a historical drama unlike any other, based on the life of Jesus as seen through the eyes of those who knew him... the

chosen. It's loaded with endearing moments as we get to know each of the disciples, boiling controversy between Jesus and the religious leaders, and an incredibly human side of Jesus filled with humor, emotion, and many of his sermons, miracles, and parables. The director, Dallas Jenkins, admits that the series is 95% fiction, but he strives for every interaction to share the gospel and point to God.

Our family adopted a Lenten practice of watching the episodes, and it has been such a blessing. We huddle in the

basement with our popcorn and are transported to the Holy Land as we walk with Jesus and his disciples. We've found that it piques our curiosity about "what it would have been like to be with Jesus," sparks conversation about his teachings, develops great empathy for the disciples and their struggles to understand and follow, and helps us see Jesus with us today.

A memorable line comes from season two when Mary Magdalene reflects on the impact Jesus had on her, drawing her out of her life of prostitution. She says, "I was one way and now I am completely different, and the thing that happened in between was Him." How true. For Mary. For us all.

The power of the gospel can often get lost in our lives.



The 24hr news cycle, doom-scrolling on our devices, or the click-bait on social media take precedent over our spiritual practices. Jesus' teaching about God's heart for the lowly is overshadowed by our desires to protect our retirement funds and protect ourselves from the neighbors we don't know. Have we forgotten how Jesus came to change us? To change the world? Jesus brings us from sin to repentance, from hatred to mercy, from death to life.



As Holy Week and Easter approach, consider how you can reclaim the place of the gospel in your life. Join with all the church in worship as we journey together through these holy days. Engage the story as you read your Bible and even encounter Jesus on the screen. Give thanks for the gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ, the one who takes us from one way to completely different.

Our midweek worship services have been poignant and powerful as we gather for prayer and singing. The music consists of meditative Taizè songs as well as familiar hymns, we join in prayer and silent reflection, and all are invited forward for anointing with oil for healing. You have two more opportunities to join us this Lent, on April 2 and 9 at 7:00 p.m.

Holy Week at Faith

What is Holy Week and what makes it holy? A definition of "holy" is "set apart for a purpose." That's what this week is... set apart, different from all

others, for a purpose. What is the purpose? Together, as the Body of Christ around the world, hear again the story of our salvation. There are praises on Palm Sunday, a mercy and betrayal on Maundy Thursday, through the betrayal and denial of Maundy Thursday, grief and glory on Good Friday, and new life through the resurrection on Easter Sunday. Make this week different from all the rest as you join us in worship every step of the way... it is, after all, holy.

Palm Sunday - April 13

On Palm Sunday, we enter Holy Week with our traditional palm procession. Gather in the entryway before worship to hear of the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem from Luke 19:28-40. Then, with palms in hand, we will celebrate and sing hosannas to Jesus, the king, who comes in the name of the Lord.




Maundy Thursday - April 17

Holy Week continues with Holy Communion at our traditional Maundy Thursday worship at 7:00 p.m. The events of the night confront power and humility in a variety of ways. Before the meal, Jesus washes the disciples' feet and gives them a command to love others. At the table, the disciples argue about who is the greatest, only to hear that the greatest must be least and the leader must be the servant.

Good Friday - April 18

Join us on Friday at 7:00 p.m. for our traditional Tenebrae service. "Tenebrae" means darkness or shadows in Latin. As we read Luke's account of Jesus' crucifixion, the shadows grow long and darkness claims the sanctuary and our hearts. We place nails in the cross to remember Jesus' death for us. The Christ

Candle departs to signify Jesus sealed in the tomb, but returns to give us hope in despair and light in the darkness.



Easter Sunday - April 20

Join us at the empty tomb as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and our grief is swept up in hope. As the sanctuary is filled with beautiful flowers and alleluias, we gather at the altar for the feast of the Lamb of God.

Road to Emmaus and First Communion - April 27

The Gospel of Luke is the only gospel to include this beautiful story of disciples on the road to Emmaus. When Jesus joins them on the road, they don't recognize him until they break bread together. On this day, we are delighted to celebrate the First Communion of Aaliyah and Alexis Simpson. Come and break bread together as we all receive communion and as our eyes are opened to see Jesus in our midst.

JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER


The Food Center continues to be very busy. The Center has applied for more help from the City Council, asking for monthly assistance rather than a yearly donation. Prices for all food have increased, and many people in Jacksonville need help. Below are the statistics for February.

The Food Center served 453 families, a total of 955 people, at a cost of \$66,410. The weekly produce and bakers tables served 293 families, a total of 497 people at a cost of \$4,725.

Our Faith Church did very well with our donations for Souper Bowl: 169.2 pounds were donated at a cost of \$845. Money donated was \$310. This was part of the total churches donations of \$5,885.81 in money and \$2,320.50 in food donations.
