Kind and grace-filled (Ephesians 4:15)

» We offer our opinions with charity and respect. We speak the truth – in love – to one another regardless of rank or position, address each other directly, and refrain from blame, criticism or gossip.

Unifying and forgiving (Ephesians 4:3,

4:32, 1 Corinthians 1:10)

» We each take personal responsibility for unity and peace, choosing to acknowledge hurt and forgive others as Christ has forgiven us.

Positive (1 Thessalonians 5:10-11)

» We seek to build each other up, rather than tear each other down. We make positive investments in each others' lives and seek to discover what is best for our community as a whole.

Honoring (Hebrews 13:7, 17-18)

» We pray for, honor, and offer trust to those whom God has given us as leaders, supporting and assisting them to the best of our ability, always approaching leaders directly to address differences.

Humble (Philippians 2)

» We exercise restraint and seek to engage each other with mutual submission, deference and compromise, when it is needed, for the sake of peace.
