### From the Garden to Glory – A Journey Through the Cross

The upper room is quiet now. The bread has been broken. The cup has been poured. The feet have been washed. The traitor has gone into the night.

And Jesus?

He has stepped into the shadows of Gethsemane.

It is there—in that moonlit garden—that the Savior of the world makes the most costly decision in history: **"Not my will, but Yours be done."** 

From Gethsemane to Golgotha, Friday unfolds with lashes, thorns, nails, and blood. Good Friday. Dark Friday. A Friday filled with injustice, brutality, and silence from heaven. The One who could calm the seas is now hanging on wood. The One who raised the dead now breathes His last. And as the skies go dark, it seems all hope has vanished.

But here's the mystery of our faith: What looked like defeat was actually victory.

What felt like the end was really the beginning. What appeared as tragedy was God's greatest triumph. Because the cross was not the final word.

The tomb would not be able to hold Him. The silence of Friday would be shattered by the song of Sunday. **He is risen. Just as He said.** 

At MVPC, we walk this sacred journey every year—not just to remember the pain, but to celebrate the promise. We pause in the garden. We weep at the cross. But we dance at the empty tomb. Easter is not a footnote. It is the headline. It is the moment heaven erupted with joy and hell was put on notice.

This weekend, we remember the full sweep of Jesus' love—from towel to tree, from grave to glory. The good news of the Gospel is not just that Jesus died, but that **He lives**, and because He lives, **we do too.** 

Let your heart be stirred. Let your faith be renewed. Let your hope rise again. See you Sunday, friends. Bring someone with you. The tomb is empty. The invitation is open.



# **March 2025 Session Meetings Highlights**

The March Session was moved from March 26 to April 2 due to Pastor David being out of town at a spiritual retreat on March 26.

Clerk Patterson reported receiving requests of membership transfers for Larry Flanigan to Celebration Lutheran Church in Sartell, Minnesota, and Jeanne Wolcott to Sunrise United Methodist Church in Holly Springs, North Carolina.

The Deacons reported that "Meet Your Deacon" Sunday would be held on April 13.

Pastor David reported on a full slate of Holy Week services: April 13, Palm Sunday, regular two services; April 17, Maundy Thursday at 7:00 p.m.; April 18, Good Friday at noon and 7:00 p.m.; and April 20, Easter Sunday at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Pastor David reported on his experience at a spiritual discovery retreat at Camp Spaulding (north of Spokane, WA) during the week of March 24. Pastor David reported that beginning in May, Grace Presbyterian Church will use MVPC's facilities for worship on Sunday afternoons while Grace waits for completion of construction of its new facility. Looking forward to corroboration opportunities with Grace. Jeanne Shaw from the Presbyterian Mission Agency will be preaching on Sunday, June 22. Pastor David performed memorial services for Rick Strasser on March 7 and Dick Hagedorn on March 8, as well as the baptism of Kimo Maiwela on March 30.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that the Chancel Choir section leader program is working well and that the Choir is thrilled to have the extra support of trained singers. Plans for Holy Week and Easter services are in place.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that the Pet Ministry donated the \$2,000 raised at its February bake sale to Pawsitive Difference and Foreclosed Upon Pets. The Sun City pet blessing will be Friday, April 11. The special offering to assist California fire victims through Presbyterian Disaster Relief totaled \$3,534. Family Promise anticipates a ribbon cutting for its new facility prior to the end of April.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) is working on Vacation Bible School for June 10-13 which may include families from Grace Presbyterian Church. Also scheduling a joint chili cookoff with Grace, tentatively June 1. Nurture will host a "Spring Fling" carnival on May 4 with barbecue, desserts, a bounce house, carnival games and a dunk tank.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups, large and small) is sponsoring a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday brunch during fellowship time each 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of a month, presented by the Men's Ministry. The first 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday brunch was on March 30.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder Al Youmans continues to stay on top of the repair needs of our facilities. Al reported that the cooling tower that services the HVAC system required replacement of a shaft, bearings and floats with a bid of \$6,900. During repairs, the contractor found that an overflow pipe also needed replacing at a cost of an additional \$800. The amounts will be paid through the Lawton estate gift which was designated to be used for facilities maintenance.

The next Session meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 23, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.








# **MVPC Book Club**


