#### THE ROAD TO EMMAUS By Pastor Adam

As I was preparing my sermon on Luke's story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus for the Sunday after Easter, I learned something interesting about Emmaus... no one knows where it is! Luke says it is about seven miles outside of Jerusalem, but none of the towns in that area bear that name. Apparently, this was news to you as well because many have come to me to hear more. Our Bible study after worship had a hay day considering why Luke would have included a fictional town in his telling of this story. "Perhaps we are all on the road to Emmaus?" one person suggested.

This is what Frederich Buchner suggests.

"Emmaus is the place we go in order to escape a bar, a movie, wherever it is we throw up our hands and say, 'let the whole damned thing go It makes no difference anyway." ... hang. Emmaus may be buying a new suit or a new car or smoking more cigarettes than you really want, or reading a second-rate novel or even writing Emmaus may be going to church on one. Sunday. Emmaus is whatever we do or wherever we go to make ourselves forget that the world holds nothing sacred: that even the wisest and bravest and loveliest decay and die; that even the noblest ideas that men have had - ideas about love and freedom and justice - have always in time been twisted out of shape by selfish men for selfish ends." (Frederick Buchner in The Magnificent Defeat)

Yes, perhaps we are all on the road to Emmaus. For the disciples, even on the day of the resurrection, they were in shock and overwhelmed from the grief of the crucifixion. Even when reports of an empty tomb start coming in, it is easier to simply walk away. As Buchner suggests, they wanted to forget that the world holds nothing sacred. You may have heard me share this in my sermon, but I'll say it again. We all have times when we desperately want to numb ourselves from our troubles, to just leave the world and all it's pain behind. We each have our own Emmaus, the place we go to hide from it all. But here's the kicker... *Jesus meets us on the road to our Emmauses!* 

In our hopelessness, in our despair, in our efforts to escape, Jesus comes to us. Jesus comes to us in the ordinary and unexpected experiences of our lives, but also, we know where to find him. When we gather at church for worship... when we sing together, pray together, fellowship together... when we break bread together, at the altar or at our own tables, Christ is present.

Let me just be frank here. *Come!* Come to the table! If you are wandering or wondering, *come!* If you are overwhelmed or underwhelmed, *come!* Come to the table and break bread with us, because Jesus promises to be here, too. Or perhaps you know someone else in these situations, looking for their own Emmaus. Go to them, invite them, bring them with you to the table.

Let me assure you again, you're not alone. We are all on the road to Emmaus. But even on the road, we are not alone. If you need a reminder, if you need to share, if you need someone to walk with you, come talk to me. I'll tell you about my road and want to know about yours as well. Then, let's all go to the table together. As Luke tells us, Jesus is revealed to us in the breaking of the bread.


# Faith Family Updates

# Reaching Up... Connecting with God through Worship

#### SUMMER WORSHIP - EXPANDING HORIZONS

This summer we are offering opportunities to expand our worship horizons. At our congregational Listening Session in February, we heard you share

desires for more traditional worship, contemporary worship, and outdoor worship. Our Worship Core Team and Council have put together a plan to do all three. On the first Sunday of each month (beginning June 1), we will have two worship services, an outdoor contemporary service at 9:30 a.m. and an indoor traditional service at 11:00 a.m. What will these services look like? I'm glad you asked...

#### OUTDOOR CONTEMPORARY - JUNE 1, 9:30 A.M.

Contemporary worship is often identified by a style of music, but "contemporary" simply means that it pertains to the current time. This contemporary service will incorporate some current music heard on Christian radio as well as some from our files. Marilyn Dichsen will help select and lead the music, utilizing her love for worship music and desire to lead. We won't have our Faith Singer choir, but invite anyone to help lead the singing. We will share a list of songs and rehearsal schedule as we get closer. The rest of the service can best be described as "Lutheran casual" with a familiar Lutheran structure, but less scripted. Bring a chair or a blanket, and stick around for fellowship afterwards. This is a great opportunity to expand your worship horizons. Bring a friend and invite them to get to know our church.

#### INDOOR TRADITIONAL JUNE 1, 11:00 A.M.

Good traditional worship is still "contemporary" as it speaks to us in our current time. Our Lutheran heritage is rich in theology and worship that connect with us today. This service will draw from the more traditional aspects of worship such as sung liturgy, familiar hymns, and all organ all the time. Our liturgy will come from the Lutheran Book of Worship (the green hymnal). For communion, we will gather around the altar by table with the option to kneel or stand. This is also a great opportunity to expand your worship horizons. Invite a friend to worship and rediscover our Lutheran heritage.

#### FIRST COMMUNION


On April 27, we celebrated first communion for Aaliyah and Alexis Simpson, granddaughters of Jeff and Shelley McDaniel.


#### **DOORBELL DINNERS - MAY 19-23**

#### JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER

The Food Center director Melissa Hall reports that the Food Center will no longer purchase toilet paper and will only give it out if toilet paper is available by donation. The decision was made to concentrate money to purchase food... the most needed items. Melissa continues to apply for grants, and she is sending letters to churches, businesses, and some individuals requesting financial support on a regular basis.

The Food Center served 436 families for food orders, a total of 892 people, at a cost of \$63,970 equally 26,187 pounds. They served 389 families for bakery, a total of 669 people at a cost of \$6,330, equally 3,890 pounds. The churches contributed \$3,362.53 in money and \$3,415.50 in food donations. Faith Church donated \$362 in money in March, as well as a check for \$1,500, and \$91.50 by weight in foods. ## FINANCIAL UPDATE

At our Annual Meeting and congregational Listening Session, some expressed a desire to clearly see a giving The Church Council and treasurers have summary. deliberated for some time how best to do this and have decided on this thermometer. At this point, we are one quarter of the way through 2025 and have received 22% of our budgeted offering.
