

#### From the Pastors View: Who Do You Say Jesus Is?

This past week in our 'Reading through the Gospels together' readings (Day 5/May 26-31) and devotional, we read of Jesus and His appearance at the Feast of Booths. (John 7:10-31)

Now in short, this story chronicles Jesus's travel to Jerusalem for this important annual feast. However, while He is there, Jesus faces some major opposition from those in the community. And this would lead even to an attempt to arrest him! This story is significant within the pages of Scripture because it suggests that there is growing stress and tension all around Jesus as His identity becomes more widespread.

The fact is that Jesus remained in constant danger of assassination while in Judea. However, in Jerusalem He could still minister. So, on the third day of the feast's celebration, He stood up to begin to teach. At this, the Jews marveled, not knowing how Jesus was educated. This gave Jesus another opportunity to make a truth claim that He was the Son of God—that He spoke with the authority of God to them.

Of course, most within the crowd were not swayed, some even claiming that He was teaching with the authority of a demon! Jesus again stands His ground. But this only eventually inflames the Pharisees more calling for officers to arrest Him!

Now as I was reading through this story of Jesus, in light of what our church has been through in the past month, I came face to face again with the two key questions that were asked in the devotional this past week:

- Q. What is your response to the question in this passage: Who do you say Jesus is?
- Q. What difference does your answer make in your interactions with others?

I wondered too, what would my response to Jesus have been that day? I, like some of you, know a good amount of Scripture. And like many of you, I try to follow God faithfully each day. However, in this passage Jesus was 'rocking the religious apple cart' of the first century. He was being a revolutionary, but in a really good way. How would we have responded to His message? In other words, who would we have said this man was?

And ultimately, what difference would it have made in how we thought and how we interacted with others?

This month, I pray that we as individuals and as a church, will stand strong in what we believe about Jesus, even as we may experience opposition for what we believe. That we will follow Him alone and not give in to the "voices" of our world.

Preschool is out for the summer! We look forward to welcoming our preschool families back in the fall!







I am still looking for substitutes for VBS in case a leader can't come a particular day. I have a particular need for Monday and Tuesday.


#### Snack:
