"Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." — Matthew 14:27b

Last month's Pacifica Synod Assembly was assembled around the theme In a New Boat. We were gathered in Dana Point, so the nautical imagery was easily woven throughout, including an actual little sailboat in the sanctuary where we were meeting! Those of you who have spent significant time in boats will lament my lack of seafaring knowledge, and I will do my best to avoid mishandling the metaphors.

The scripture our time was centered around was a pretty famous story of the disciples in a boat, as those fishermen often were—the one where Jesus walks on water. The disciples are already aboard, and Jesus has gone up a mountain to pray. By the time he returns to them, a fierce storm has blown in, and they are all afraid. Not just afraid of the storm, but of the figure they see walking toward them, as they have never seen a person walk on the sea before. But Jesus immediately comforts them, saying "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

To prove it's Jesus, Peter insists that he also walk on the water. We know that Peter is often the first to jump right into whatever is happening, so it should not surprise us that it is he who makes this demand. Often, we interpret the next part—where Peter falls into the sea—to be about Peter's lack of faith. But in his sermon, Bishop Dave invited us to focus instead on the courage it took for Peter to take the first step out of the boat. Jesus was outside of the boat, and Peter wanted to go to him. He believed that, with the help of Jesus, he could step out of the boat and into the unknown.

The suggestion that Bishop Dave made throughout the assembly was that we draw on that same courage to step out of the boats of our comfort zones and into the storm that surrounds us. The tumultuous nature of our nation and world is as treacherous as a stormy sea. We are much safer in our boats than out. But where is Jesus? And where is Jesus calling us?

Leaders from throughout our synod invited us to consider what kind of boat our congregation is currently maneuvering, and what kind of boat might be easier to navigate these waters. Some of us might think of our churches as steam ships—slow-moving and hard to change direction. Some of us might think of our churches as sailboats—subject to the whims of the wind and whoever is at the helm. Some of us might think of our churches as fishing trawlers—dragging a net behind us and hoping to catch something. I am sure that you can think of even more metaphors!

But it may be that the boats we've always been in, though excellent when we got into them, are just not the right vessel for the water we're in now. Maybe we need a kayak, agile and adept at rough water. Maybe we need a canoe, designed for reaching unreachable places. Maybe we need a catamaran, stable and sturdy.

There isn't a one-boat-fits-all answer to how each of our congregations will navigate the future. But as we look out at the stormy sea of our troubled world, it is clear that our old boats are not outfitted for the rapidly changing conditions. What can we do that keeps us afloat but isn't content with staying docked? What can we imagine that makes room for new passengers without making anyone go overboard? What can we design that travels far and makes it home safely? We're going to need all hands on deck.

The one thing we can know for sure is that in every boat, in every storm, God is with us. Jesus is reaching out a hand to invite us into the unknown, never leaving us marooned. We may not know where we are going, exactly, but we know The Way.

Council Update


Hello SMLC! Here are the updates for the May Council meeting.

The Council met on May 21 for our regular monthly meeting. The Council accepted and/or approved the submitted minutes and reports. The Council considered 2 items of business: 1) the Council approved the section from the Ministry Events Policy that described the Information and Marketing materials that will be available for use to organize and operate an event, and 2) the Council discussed and approved a plan to resolve a problem with the HVAC system for the office and sanctuary building. With summer on its way, it is important to make sure the air conditioner is functioning properly. Lastly, the Council discussed and drafted the policy for the use of our parking lots and the alcohol, tobacco, and substance use policy for ministry events. These policies will be considered for approval at the June council meeting and will provide additional guidance to Pastor Casey, the SMLC staff, and event volunteers as we continue to plan these events, such as the 4th of July parking lot celebration.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as president for 2025 and for your continued support of SMLC, our Council, Pastor Casey, and the staff.

What does this mean for us as Lutherans? It means learning about the diversity of God's creation and beginning (or continuing) the holy work of affirming every person as a bearer of God's image. There are many resources available to you in this endeavor, and different points of entry based on your knowledge and comfort. Everyone deserves to start at the beginning, and there is no shame in being a beginner. And if you are a member of the LGBTQIA+ community, I'm so glad you're here!

Why are we talking about this at church? Because we bring our whole selves and our whole lives to God, we bring our whole selves and our whole lives to church with us. Our church needs to be a safe place for everyone's whole selves and whole lives. Perhaps you've followed news about gender-affirming medical care, how schools should protect vulnerable students, and which civil rights are afforded to whom; these are issues that affect us, our neighbors, our families, members of the San Marcos Lutheran Church community, and our society at large, which is why it is crucial that we understand them.

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the Romans, it is written: "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Our gender, our sexual orientation, and the ways we express those facets of ourselves are part of what make us all bearers of God's image.

- The <u>Transmission Ministry Collective</u> provides transgender Christians (and their loved ones) across the country with support groups, workshops, Bible studies, and other resources.
- The Association of American Medical Colleges answers <u>"What is gender-affirming care?"</u> and other questions you may have.
