- Q. What do you think the feast in the Kingdom of God will be like?

June23-28/ Day 2: Read Luke 13:31-35; John 10:22-42 – Sorrow for the unbelief of the Jews in Jerusalem

- Q. What were Jesus's goals? What did Jesus have to go to Jerusalem? (v. 32-33)
- Q. Why did Jesus say that the Jews should believe in His miracles? (v 38) Why does Jesus' claim to be God cause people to oppose Him?

June23-28/ Day 3: Read Luke 14:1-14 – Jesus at a Pharisees home

- Q. Under what circumstance did the religious and legal experts allow work on the Sabbath? (v. 5-6)
- Q. How did Jesus communicate the value of humility? (v. 11)
- Q. What benefits could you realize by consistently making humble choices in your life?

June23-28/ Day 4: Read Luke 14:15-35 – The Cost of being a disciple

- Q. What consequences result from not counting the cost before building? (v. 29-30)
- Q. How do most people react to Jesus' terms of discipleship?
- Q. What costs do you need to count in responding to Jesus's call to be His discipleship this week?

June23-28/ Day 5: Read John 10:1-21 – The Shepherd and His flock

- Q. What kind of relationship do sheep have with their shepherd? Why won't sheep follow a stranger (v. 5)
- Q. How did Jesus contrast His coming with the coming of a thief? (v. 10)

June 23-28/ Day 6: Study and Meditation - Consider the following questions:

- Q. How can you be more attentive to the voice of Jesus this week? What steps will you take to follow Him?
- Q. What relationships or other loyalties do you need to pray about to strengthen your loyalty to Jesus?
