

## **Territorial Acknowledgement**

Leader: As we gather today, we acknowledge, with gratitude, that we do so on the traditional and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) People first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

**People:** We give thanks for this land and all those who have been stewards of it; for their stories and for their lives – past, present, and future. We commit ourselves to prayerfully seek reconciliation, justice, and healing that we might listen and learn to be faithful stewards of this good land and live in right relationship.

#### The Proclamation of the Word


#### The Frist Reading

*Reader* A reading from Isaiah (40:25-31)

To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Long ago, in the time before all days, before the creation of all things, the one who is known as the Word was there face to face with the Great Spirit. The Word fully represents Creator and show us who he is and what he is like. He has always been there from the beginning, for the Word and Creator are one and the same. Through the Word all things

came into being, and not one thing exists that he did not create. Creator's life shined out from the Word, giving light to all human beings. This is the true Light that comes to all the peoples of the world and shines on everyone. The Light shines into the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it or put it out. Into the wilderness of the Land of Promise (Judea) came a man named Gift of Goodwill (John). He was sent by the Great Spirit to tell what he knew about the Light so everyone could believe. He was not the Light but came to speak the truth about the Light. The true Light that shines on all people was coming into the darkness of this world. He came down into this world, and even though he made all things, the world did not recognize him. Even his own tribe did not welcome or honor him. But all who welcome and trust him receive their birthright as children of the Great Spirit. They are born in a new way, not from a human father's plans or desires, but born from above – by the Great Spirit. Creator's Word became a flesh and blood human being and pitched his sacred tent among us, living as one of us. We looked upon his great beauty and saw how honorable he was, the kind of honor held only by this one Son who fully represents his Father – full of his great kindness and truth. Gift of Goodwill (John) told what he knew about him and cried out with a loud voice, "The one I have told you about is here! He comes after me, but is much greater – my elder! He has more honor, for even though he is thought to be younger, he existed before I was born." From the fullness of his being we have all had many gifts of kindness poured out on us. Drawn from the Water (Moses) gave us our tribal laws, but the gift of great kindness and truth came from Creator Sets Free (Jesus), the Chosen One. No one has ever seen the Great Spirit, but the one Son, who is himself the Great Spirit and closest to the Father's heart, has shown us what he is like.

## The Apostles' Creed

*Celebrant* Creator God, we give you thanks and praise for your generous love and goodness to us and to all people.

In the beginning, you formed our earth from the dust of stars.

In the beginning, you formed continents in the midst of the watery chaos. In the beginning, you formed us from the same earth and breathed your Spirit into us. You sent us forth, East and West and North and South, to people your world, to love and care for the land, to live in harmony with you, with one another, and with all your creatures.

In our arrogance we have turned away from you, and turned against one another.

We have forgotten that we were fashioned of the earth;

we have exploited the earth and lorded over your creatures.

We have forgotten that we are all your children.

We have turned on one another with contempt and violence.

We have taken our brothers' and sisters' land.

We have attempted to rob them of their culture, their language, their pride, their dignity.

Yet in your infinite mercy you do not forsake us.

You send prophets and elders, to proclaim your Word, to impart your Wisdom, to call us back into right relations with the earth, with each other, and with you.

And so, with all of your creation, with the wolf and the loon, the birch and the bullrush, with the ancient rocks of our land, and the fiery Northern Lights, and with siblings everywhere of good faith, we join our voices in their unending hymn of praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the One who comes
in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed indeed is your child Creator Sets Free (Jesus), whom you sent among us to show us the face of your compassion.

He came to the disenfranchised and restored their dignity, reminding them that you dwell in them, and they bear your image.

He reached out to those broken in spirit with your healing power.

He gathered the children into the security of your love.

He confronted the powers with courage and non-violence.

He unmasked those who abused others in the name of religion.

In all things he showed us the path of respect and reconciliation.

On the night he was betrayed, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) shared a meal with his friends.

He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them, saying: "Take this and share it. This is my body"

– given in solidarity with all who suffer contempt and oppression.

After supper he took the cup, and passed it to them, saying:

- "Take this and share it. This is my blood"
- shed in love for all who suffer violence and injustice.
- "Do this, whenever you gather, and remember."

Gracious Creator, as we offer you these fruits of the earth, we remember his death, which shows us your love for the hurting; we celebrate his resurrection, which assures us of your power to heal every hurt; we long for his coming again, when we will be truly reconciled in the peace and mutual respect you intend.

Send the Great Spirit upon these gifts, and upon our hearts so that they may be our spiritual food and drink.

Open our hearts to:

the Spirit of wisdom, who will lead us into all truth;

the Spirit of love, who will cast out all fear;

the Spirit of peace, who will comfort our troubled hearts;

the Spirit of truth, who will truly set us free.

Work through us, we pray, and through all your people, so that we may respectfully receive this feast and serve you in each other. To continue your work of reconciliation, to reknit the torn fabric of your world, to heal the broken hearts, and to bring all of us, of every language and culture, from East and West and North and South, to join in that wondrously diverse feast of your

forever and ever. Amen.

\*Today's Gospel Text: This translation of the Good Story is dedicated to the Indigenous Peoples of Turtle Island (North America) – the Tribal Nations that call this land home. We pray the First Nations Version will bring healing to those who have suffered under the dominance of colonial governments who, with the help of churches and missionary organizations, took our land, our languages, our cultures, and even our children. As our Tribal Nations work hard to reclaim what has been stolen, it is our hope that the colonial language that was forced upon us can now serve our people in a good way, by presenting *Creator Sets Free* (Jesus) in a more culturally relevant context.

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For generations, many Indigenous groups and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on June 21 or around that time of year because of the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.

National Aboriginal Day, now National Indigenous Peoples Day, was announced in 1996 by then Governor General of Canada, Roméo LeBlanc, through the Proclamation Declaring June 21 of Each Year as National Aboriginal Day. This was the result of consultations and statements of support for such a day made by various Indigenous groups:

- in 1982, the National Indian Brotherhood, now the Assembly of First Nations, called for the creation of National Aboriginal Solidarity Day
- in 1995, the Sacred Assembly, a national conference of Indigenous and non-Indigenous people chaired by Elijah Harper, called for a national holiday to celebrate the contributions of Indigenous Peoples
- also in 1995, the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples recommended the designation of a National First Peoples Day

On June 21, 2017, the Prime Minister issued a statement announcing the intention to rename this day **National Indigenous Peoples Day.** 

National Indigenous Peoples Day is part of the Celebrate Canada program, which also includes Saint-Jean-Baptiste Day on June 24, Canadian Multiculturalism Day on June 27 and Canada Day on July 1.

The Government of Canada provides funding opportunities for community celebratory events, as well as for commemorations on the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.
