From the Pastors View: 'God's Timing'

One of the hardest things for any of us to do, (yes, even if we are faithful followers of Jesus) is to trust God in His timina. There are things and prayers that we place in God's hands, but often the struggle in our requests and prayers is in His timing. In our hurried world, He seems to be late, and not meeting our time expectations. It leads us to question: "Doesn't He know and doesn't He care?"

To be sure, in our "microwave/IPhone/instant-everything" society, one of the toughest things is to trust God and wait, especially in times (or seasons/months/years) of uncertainty.

In these situations, one Scripture which I shared at Tom Shelton's memorial service from Ecclesiastes, comes to mind, where Solomon writes:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. - Ecclesiastes 3:1

This verse and others like it, are a great reminder for us that God is truly in control of the events of our lives. But not only is He in control, but His timing is perfect. It's perfect, even when it may not align with our expectations.

There are two great reminders then about trusting in God's timing. First, to trust in His timing means that we must give up our own desire for immediate results!

And second, that we acknowledge God's wisdom and sovereignty, knowing that He, God, sees the bigger picture of our lives, and knows what is best for us. Because the fact is, that when we trust in God's timing for our lives, we are able to let go of our anxiety and practice patience. And I think that this will lead to confidence that He will fulfill His promises in His time.

We see throughout Scripture that God's timing is marked by His faithfulness and love to us. A very familiar verse in Romans chapter eight tells us that, we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose. (Romans 8:28 ESV).

Even though it's difficult, we need to remember to believe that He will work all things together for good, even in those times of delay or apparent silence. Because trusting in God's timing will prepare and refine our eternal character, as we are aligned more to His glory and our ultimate good.

Looking back on my life, I can see that God's timing brought blessings! Because in those seasons of waiting, either for a new job or a healing for Angie, God has taught me to pursue several thinas:

- A greater dependence on Jesus!
- A deepening of my faith!

Opened doors that I never could have imagined before my time of waiting and trusting.

Today, if you are finding that you are waiting for something, even growing discouraged, try to rest in God's Biblical promises to develop that trust in His timing. Think too about your life experiences and try to recall a time when Jesus came through at just the right time. Finally, seek God through prayer and His Word, knowing that He is faithful to fulfill His plans for you at HIS appointed time.


Church Picnic and Baptism



What are Jubilee Churches?

Jubilee churches of Gloucester is a coalition of churches working together to prevent homelessness. The common work of the congregations began in 2023 by furnishing apartments for those transitioning out of homelessness. It then expanded into collaborating resources to meet financial needs of those on the verge of becoming homeless in partnership with Gloucester United Emergency Sheltering Team (GUEST).

Who are a part of the Jubilee churches?

Abingdon Episcopal, Apostles Lutheran, Bellamy United Methodist, Bethany UMC, Bethel Baptist, Church of St. Therese, First Baptist, Gleaning Baptist, Gloucester Point Baptist Church, Grace Covenant Presbyterian, Morning Glory Baptist, New Mount Zion Baptist, Newington Baptist, Saint Paul Baptist, Salem Community, Shepherdsville Baptist, St. James On-The-Glebe Anglican, Susanna Wesley United Methodist and Ware Episcopal

What can Jubilee Churches provide for its congregations?

Our partnership with GUEST allows churches to "vet" any request for funding to:

- Make sure that the request is valid

- Connect client with other aid and services for which they may qualify - Save client from having to contact multiple churches for assistance - Allow churches to pool their resources and thus respond to needs, areater than any one church can financially handle

And during May, Jubilee Churches provided support to 6 families, totaling \$2,339. Assistance was provided for rent and Dominion power assistance. As of June 4th, the current balance of the Jubilee Fund is \$5,367.

A testimony of how Jubilee Churches specifically helped...

A young mother in our community who has a two and four year old depending on her, suddenly lost her job and quickly fell behind on rent. So, as the threat of eviction and a court date quickly approached, fear and uncertainty took hold.

But even in her struggle, she showed remarkable determination!

She guickly found new employment and began working again, confident that her new income would be enough to support her family moving forward. She also turned to GUEST and Jubilee Churches looking for help—doing everything she could to protect the home her children know and love until she was able to start receiving pay from her new employer. As well, for the first time, she reached out for support from the community.

And because of the generosity and prayers of people like those in the Jubilee churches, we were able to walk alongside her, providing financial assistance to prevent the eviction!

Thank you to Newington for continuing to contribute to our deacon benevolence fund which goes to help fund our church's role in the Jubilee Churches outreach ministry!


