### BEYOND OUR WALLS By Pastor Adam

This past month, Desmond turned 5. Think back to your fifth birthday, or the birthday of any kids you know. You'll probably think of parties with cartoon characters. Parties at parks or pizza places. Not Desmond. Where was his party? The laundromat. No, it wasn't a punishment... it was his dream come

true! Desmond LOVES laundry and has been doing our family's wash for the last year. When he visits a friend's house, he immediately has to inquire as to the whereabouts of their laundry room. Front-loaders are passe. He gets all excited when he can find a top-loader, with an agitator! And it's his lucky day when our friends need help with a load or two.

So, yes, we spent Desmond's birthday at the laundromat, right after mowing the lawn and before driving through the carwash, two of his other passions. But while we were there, I realized something. I had never been in a Jacksonville laundromat before. We are fortunate to have a washer and dryer at home, and a 5yr-old who does ten loads a day. When I looked around, I began to notice a community in which I had never participated. There were some vending machines and tables where people could eat. A food truck outside offered surprisingly good Asian cooking. A "Little Library" was stocked with books for kids to read while passing time on the spin cycle. I had been driving by this place for years and had never taken time to observe the ecosystem within.

Last month I attended the Central/Southern IL Synod Assembly with Jean Welch, Marilyn, Mindy Carlson, and Patty Nelson. It's three days of worship, business, fellowship, and celebrating/discerning the Spirit's work in the church. Our guest speaker led us in fascinating conversations about "Faithful Innovations" and how we can bring the church beyond our walls. The first step is simply to look and listen. He encouraged us to do a neighborhood walk around our

church. To simply observe what we see and hear, taking time to recognize what we may have missed or forgotten from familiarity. There in the laundromat, my eyes were being opened to a whole different world with services and needs that I had never noticed. Could the laundromat be a place for ministry? Is this an opportunity for being church beyond our building? Might the Holy Spirit already be at work before I walked in?

The answer to all three of these questions is an emphatic, YES!!! However, it might not be the ministry to which God is calling us. Is God calling us to explore places for ministry in our community? Are there opportunities for us to be the church beyond our building? Might the Holy Spirit be at work in places all around us, inviting us to get on board? The answer to these questions is another emphatic, YES!!!

I encourage you (challenge you) to look and listen. Venture beyond the walls of our church, and the walls of your home. Share it with others and consider what we could do together. Is the Holy Spirit at work and calling us to ministry to our community beyond our church walls? Again... YES!!!


### Faith Family Updates

The outdoor contemporary service is more casual with a less scripted liturgy. The music selection includes some of our familiar contemporary songs, as well as those you may hear on the radio. The indoor traditional service is more formal with a sung liturgy from the familiar Lutheran Book of Worship (green hymnal). The music selection includes familiar hymns led on the organ. Our first Sunday summer services will be held on **July 6**, **August 3**, and **September 7**.


### SERMON SERIES: BUILDING UP THE BODY OF CHRIST

### PEDAL FOR A PURPOSE AND MADAGASCAR: TWO SYNOD FUNDRAISERS

At this year's synod assembly, churches across our Central/Southern Illinois Synod joined in supporting our campus ministries through Pedal for a Purpose, and our partnership with two

companion synods in the Malagasy Lutheran Church of Madagascar. Pedal for a Purpose was a 67-mile bike ride from St. Andrew's Campus Ministry at the University of Illinois in Champaign to AGAPE Campus Ministry of Illinois State University in Bloomington. It was a rainy, windy day, but we made it! Not only did we learn about these wonderful ministries and eat with some of their students and leaders, but together we raised over \$5,000 to support the important work they do. Our support for our companion synods in Madagascar goes far beyond money, but through the offering collected at the festival worship service, we raised over \$14,000 for this partnership.
