P: The peace of the Lord be with you always.




P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 28<sup>th</sup> chapter.


# SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

P: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, ... and join their unending hymn:




#### \*Words of Institution




#### Communion Hymn


