The Liberating Power of a Holy "No"

My phone once tallied 42 notifications that opened with, "Pastor, could you...?" By sundown I had promised to lead a bake sale, bless a llama, and coach Little League—none of which appear in my call agreement (even in the Greek!). That manic Monday illustrated what psychologists call **ego-depletion**: every unnecessary *yes* drains the finite self-control we need for the tasks that truly matter. In the classic 1998 "radishes-versus-cookies" experiment, participants who resisted chocolate gave up sooner on hard puzzles because their willpower tank was empty.

Saying *no*, then, isn't selfish; it's stewardship. Marketing professor **Dr. Vanessa Patrick** labels it an "empowered refusal"—a boundary rooted in identity and values that releases us to pursue God-given purposes. A 2024 wellness review showed that people who practice empowered refusal report lower stress, better sleep, and greater life satisfaction.

Psychology Today likewise notes that strategic *no's* boost self-esteem and deepen relationships. In other words, every "no" becomes a louder "yes" to health, family, creativity—and the still, small voice of the Spirit.

Scripture agrees. Jesus regularly "withdrew to lonely places and prayed" (Luke 5:16), declined the crowd's push to become a bread-king (John 6:15), and taught, "Let your 'Yes' be yes and your 'No,' no" (Matt 5:37). The apostle Paul urges us to "make the most of every opportunity" (Eph 5:16)—impossible when our calendars already look like a Costco sample tray.

Author Bob Goff jokes, "Every time you say *yes* with your mouth, make sure you're not saying *no* with your heart." Try it this week: when an invitation arrives, pause. Ask, "If I say yes, what God-priority might I automatically decline?" Then practice the holy two-letter liturgy: "No, thank you." It's short, sweet, and—like strong espresso—surprisingly energizing.

For fun, keep a **"Yes Jar."** Each time you resist the urge to over-commit, drop in a marble. When it's full, celebrate the reclaimed margin: date night, prayer walk, nap (in that order!). You'll discover the Kingdom advances not through frantic activity but through focused obedience. And yes, it even leaves time for Sunday morning tennis.

So, let's learn to pronounce *No* with the same joy we shout "Amen." After all, every good gardener prunes so the vine can bear better fruit (John 15:2). Pruned calendars produce vibrant disciples.

June 2025 Session Meetings Highlights

Our industrious Deacons are already working on projects for the fall and holidays. The Deacons are planning an outreach event for September 23 titled "Decluttering Strategies." The Deacons are looking at marketing opportunities for more community participation in the annual Service of Solace scheduled for December 7.

Pastor David reported the services on Sunday, June 22, with the Rev. Jeanie Shaw from the Synod of the Pacific went very well. The Summer Supper Studies (sponsored by Men's Ministry) kicks off on Tuesday, June 24, with subsequent events on Tuesday, July 22 and Tuesday, August 26. Sunday, June 29 will be themed "Baseball Sunday." The Fuller Spiritual Formation Group held its second training session on June 20 and 21.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that the gifts presented to men at worship services on Father's Day, June 15, were well received. The Commission is researching a new baptismal font that will remain in the front of the Sanctuary.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that the Dementia Support Group "Healthy Living for the Brain & Body" program on Saturday, June 7 had 22 attendees. The Pet Ministry will assemble pet care bags for the homeless on Sunday, June 29. The Project 150 Father's Day collection of clothes and toiletries was very successful and the collected items have been delivered to Project 150. The new Family Promise facilities have a grand opening scheduled for August 21 with kitchen and pantry facilities being named for deceased MVPC member Ruth Anne Kendy.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that Vacation Bible School held on June 10-13 had 42 children attending, including families from Grace Presbyterian Church. The Youth Group mission trip to Loveland, Colorado is scheduled for the end of July with 5 senior youth and 2 counselors currently registered. Women's Ministry sponsored a Technology Workshop on Tuesday, June 17, with 4 youth "tutors" helping to answer questions regarding cell phones and computer devises. A game (Bingo) and potluck night is scheduled for Sunday, July 13. Women's Ministry will sponsor the Summer Pie-Palooza! on Tuesday, July 29 at 2:00 p.m.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) noted that the next 5th Sunday brunch will be Sunday, June 29 to coincide with "Baseball Sunday."

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). The Finance Committee chair Andrew Patterson presented the proposed 2025-2026 fiscal year budget, which Session approved. Elder Al Youmans reported that the improvements to the exterior lighting at the front of the building facing the corner of Del Webb Boulevard and Sungold Drive have been completed.

MVPC has entered into a contract with Dwyer Engineering to provide cost analysis for the proposed outdoor play area. A congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, June 29 between worship services for the purpose of approving the terms of call for Pastor David for the fiscal year 2025-2026.
