The Cathedral community is delighted to welcome this morning, The Reverend Dr. Kate Heichler, our new Assistant Priest for Congregational Life and Community Engagement.

Revd. Kate brings with her a dynamic blend of pastoral experience, creative vision, and a deep commitment to connecting faith with action. A graduate of Yale Divinity School, she received her Doctor of Ministry from Hartford International University for Religion and Peace, with a focus on Missional Church Studies and Church Growth. She was ordained in the Episcopal Church in 2003.

Much of Kate's ministry has taken place in Connecticut, where she led a regional interfaith council, coordinated evangelism training for the Episcopal Diocese of Connecticut, and developed an experimental missional initiative in Stamford. She has also been deeply involved in outreach ministries to and with people experiencing homelessness, including advocacy efforts to help end homelessness in her communities.

Since 2018, she has served as Rector of Christ Church, La Plata and Christ Church, Wayside in Maryland, where she was known for her innovative worship, pastoral care, and her ability to help congregations reimagine their role in the life of the wider community.

Revd. Kate also brings gifts in the arts and media. She holds a degree in Drama, is a writer, podcaster, and musician, and composes both songs and liturgical music. Kate's vision for church life is grounded in engagement and outreach. As she puts it:

"I believe we are most fully the church when we're outside our buildings. What we do inside is celebrate and recharge — our real life as a church happens beyond our walls."

We are excited to welcome the Revd. Dr. Kate Heichler to the Cathedral and look forward to the energy, faith, and imagination she brings to this new role among us.

The Proclamation of the Word

The First Reading:

Reader A reading from Hosea 11:1-11

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them. I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks. I bent down to them and fed them. They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all.

How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath. They shall go after the Lord, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west. They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria; and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

The Epistle

Reader A reading from Colossians 3:1-11

So, if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things—anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

People Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
