- How does Peter describe Christian freedom, and what boundaries does he place around it?
- What is God saying to you in these verses?

REFLECT

- Which of these rebellious acts have you personally justified?

 - 3. Not getting a building permit
 - 4. Watering on non-water days
 - 5. Cheating on job applications or exams
 - 6. Jaywalking
 - 7. Littering (two-and four legged)
 - 8. Not getting license for pets/dogs without leash
 - 9. Netflixing on someone else's account
 - 10. Singing Macarena in public

- What authorities in your life do you find hard to submit to? How might surrender become an act of trust?
