#### MDP - Narratives

How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

With Christ at our center, we aspire to be a more welcoming, inclusive church, instilling a sense of dignity, ability, and worth in all people. We are committed to the education and nurture of adults, youth, and children, teaching the heritage, theology, and ethics of the Christian faith and the Reformed Tradition, and to providing opportunities to translate that knowledge into action in our local community and the world.

We envision an increased vitality within our congregation, in which we receive affirmation from our faith and from which we engage in the struggle for justice, give of ourselves, and of our resources in service of others, and work with Christ in the establishing of His just, peaceable, and loving rule in the world.

Our mission statement reflects both our intentions and our actual work. We regularly engage in an expansive array of service activities and mission projects, some of which are long-standing. In the Winchester community, we cooperate in a seasonal thermal shelter, a weekly meal service, and refugee services. As a *Matthew 25 Church*, we seek not only to build congregational vitality, but to work for the dismantling of structural racism and the eradication of systemic poverty. As an *Earth Care Congregation*, we try to be careful, humble stewards of creation, teaching, and preaching conservation as a theological issue, while operating our facilities efficiently and with concern for the world around us.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

For over 200 years, our home has been in the heart of what is now the vibrant Old Town district. The city of Winchester, (pop. 28,000) and surrounding Frederick County (pop. 98,000), comprise the fastest growing region in Virginia. Our church reflects the community mix of urban, suburban, and rural populations. Predominantly white (80%), the region's demographic mix includes Hispanic, Black, and Asian populations. Since 2023, the region has become home to refugees from Afghanistan, Syria, and other areas of the world. The 65+ age group is the fastest-growing segment in the region, and Winchester is considered a top retirement location.

Currently, we work with the unhoused and assist the growing number of people experiencing food and/or financial insecurity. We also recognize other concerns: the increased need for mental health services, the growing danger of substance abuse, and the lack of affordable housing in our community. We seek a pastor to help us address these concerns, while helping us overcome the spiritual disconnection accelerated by the pandemic.

A positive emerging trend is the rapidly growing population aged 65+, most of whom are new to the area. We are aware that connection with the retired demographic would have the potential to bring in more members who may be fulfilled by connection with a Christian and volunteer congregation.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

For several years, uncertainty has affected our staffing model. FPC has moved from three pastors in 2017, to the present, where we are transitioning from two pastoral leaders to one. Our next pastor should have the experience required to help the congregation move into this new reality in a positive way.

FPC is blessed with talented staff with expertise in various areas. Staff efforts would be complemented by a minister who models servant leadership, recognizes their gifts and abilities, and can mesh traditional and non-traditional ideas on how the staff accomplishes its tasks. Short-term goals include empowering our newly formed board of deacons, expanding educational offerings for all generations, providing additional fellowship opportunities, improving new member training and mentoring, improving communication with the non-tech savvy, plus "right-sizing" and revitalizing our mission outreach. In addition, we wish to engage the area's expanding retiree population, while drawing families and children from the community, especially from our partnered Weekday School.

Our long-term goals are fundamental in nature. We must address the substantial decline in attendance, giving, and other key metrics. We recognize this is a lot for a pastor to undertake and seek someone who can empower the congregation to rise to this occasion working toward the achievement of these and other goals with awareness and sensitivity to differing preferences and opinions regarding controversial issues.

- Lead and develop Christian education opportunities through both direct teaching, and training of lay leaders for all age levels (help us help ourselves)
- Serve as head of staff and perform other administrative duties

- Represent FPC in the Downtown Clergy Association and Interfaith Council
- Conduct weddings, baptisms, funerals, and other special services
