THE GOOD NEWS

God looked at all of this creation, and proclaimed that this was good—very good. — Genesis 1:31a

I am sitting down to write this on the First Day of School—not for me, though I am sure you can imagine that I was delighted to return to school each fall of the 20 years I spent going from kindergarten through seminary. It is Mr. Dunsworth's return to the classroom; these days I only go back to school by association.

If you are not a student or an educator or a person whose life revolves around semesters or quarters, I wonder if you (like me) still feel a sense of newness arriving at this time of year. In one of my favorite movies, I998's You've Got Mail, stars Meg Ryan and Tom Hanks wax poetic about autumn—it makes them want to buy school supplies. (He'd send her a bouquet of sharpened pencils, if he knew her name and address.)

Our Jewish siblings share in this schedule, as their New Year celebration happens in September. Rosh Hashanah celebrates God's good work of creation, and begins on the evening of September 22 this year. This holiday is marked with several traditions, the most delicious of which is to usher in a "sweet" new year by eating apples and honey.

The Church's new year celebration is in late November, on the first Sunday of Advent. That'll be here before we know it, but not yet! We do, though, enter into a slightly different rhythm here as the seasons change. This month kicks off with God's Work Our Hands on Sunday, September 7; we'll have an abbreviated worship service to bless the hands that will do the work of serving our neighbors. There is more information about the projects we'll be completing in this newsletter.

Later in the month, we'll observe the International Day of Peace and enjoy Committee Sunday during Community Time—both on September 21. Come to worship to let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts (Colossians 3:15) and to learn about all the good work being done here at SMLC—which you can join in as the Spirit moves you!

We'll be joined on Sunday, September 28 by the Palomar Chamber Singers, who will offer their gifts of song during our liturgy—their concert is the following Saturday, October 4, also in our sanctuary. (If you plan to attend that concert, be sure to get your tickets in advance, as it will sell out.)

There is much to look forward to as a community as we transition—though still in Ordinary Time—out of summer and into the fall. What good things are you anticipating these days? Where do you see God's good creation (yourself included, beloved child!) coming to life in this new season? Let's keep these seasonal metaphors going—what goodness are you harvesting?

God is at work in you in every season. God is at work in our congregation, urging us onward in our pursuits of community, peace, justice, gratitude, joy—and many other good things. There is a place for you, however new or not-so-new you feel you are, in this community and in the family of God.

Council Updates:

Hello SMLC! Here are the updates for the August Council meeting.

After taking a summer break for July, the Council met on August 20 for our regular monthly meeting. The Council accepted and/or approved the submitted minutes and reports. The Council considered 3 items of business: 1) the Council approved the section from the Ministry Events Policy that described the volunteer and committee involvement, and food policy; 2) the Council approved the final Ministry Event Policy, and 3) the Council approved the recommendation from the Property and Infrastructure committee to replace the supplemental HVAC unit for the office building and sanctuary.

Lastly, the Council discussed the upcoming committee appointments required in our constitution including the Nominating Committee and Budget Committee. These are important committees that help to determine the path forward for SMLC into next year. The Council also discussed the Stewardship committee and its needs as we begin the season of stewardship and financial pledging for 2026. If you have interest in serving on these committees please





What does it mean to serve God and your community at SMLC through a leadership position? It is less scary and more rewarding than you might think.

The business of the church is done by the Congregation Council, setting the table for the ministry of the congregation.

Each year, we elect members to our Congregation Council for three-year terms. Members may seek re-election and remain on the council for a second consecutive term. There are also officers on the council—President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Currently, our officers are Dan Norris, Kelly Van Jen, Anne Voth, and Jan Parthemer, respectively.

At our Congregational Meeting in December, we need to elect a new Treasurer as well as up to three new Council Members. Perhaps God is calling you to serve in this way, but you're unsure exactly what you'd be getting yourself into. Here's a basic overview of what those roles are about, so you can prayerfully consider them:

Council Members are responsible for:

- Attending council meetings on the third Wednesday of each month in Luther Hall. Meetings come to order at 7pm and finish around 8:30pm; those who wish gather at 6:30 to assemble sack lunches for asylum-seekers as part of our ministry with AMMPARO. (This, along with any preparation time, is the vast majority of the time commitment to serve on Council.)
- Preparing for our meetings by reading over the reports submitted by the Pastor, the President, the Bookkeeper, and the Committee Chairs, then bringing any questions about the content of those reports to the meeting for discussion. All these documents are housed on a Google Drive.
- Collaborating with the other members of the council on issues of finances and the property of the church, ensuring that we are being the best possible stewards of the resources God has entrusted to us.
- Brainstorming creative solutions to the problems we encounter as we go about our ministry.
- Responding in a timely manner to communication from the President about any necessary email votes.

In addition to their general responsibilities as a Council Member, the Treasurer is also responsible for:

- Collaborating with the SMLC Bookkeeper to understand the general financial position of the congregation
- Communicating any questions or concerns from the Council to the Bookkeeper, and vice versa
- Signing checks on a schedule established with the Bookkeeper
- Serving on the annual Budget Committee, attending a handful of Zoom meetings in the fall and winter
- Collaborating with the Bookkeeper to present the budget at the Annual Congregational Meeting in February

To serve as a Council Member or as Treasurer, you do not have to have any experience serving on a council or board, or any experience reading financial statements. Everyone learns together! There is a whole community of existing council members and the staff of the congregation who want to make sure you feel comfortable and confident in your service. Questions are always welcome!

One last thing: in accordance with California state law, all members of the Congregation Council are required to undergo Live Scan background checks and to complete a two-hour online Mandated Reporter training. As leaders of the congregation, prioritizing the protection of our most vulnerable members is paramount. If you have any questions about what this means, you can ask Pastor Casey or our Child Safety Coordinator, Karin Kupka.

If you are prayerfully considering service on the Congregation Council and have questions not answered here, you have options! You can contact Congregation President Dan Norris, Pastor Casey, or chat with any current member of the council to get their perspective. Unsure who that is? Visit sanmarcoslutheran.org/about/our-team to see the list. And, if you want to read the full description of the council's role in the ELCA Constitution, we can help you access that, too.

Interested in learning more about our many committees? Committee Sunday is September 21st!

Curious about how ministry is organized at SMLC? There's a committee for that.

Several committees are engaged in the work of the gospel in our community. Some of them are standing (operate all the time) and some are *ad hoc* (operate for a short time on something specific). Our *ad hoc* committees are marked here with an asterisk.

Budget* Endowment Evangelism Faith Formation

Fellowship Nominating*

Property & Infrastructure Social Action

Stewardship*
Worship & Music

Each of these committees has a chairperson, some of whom currently serve on the Congregation Council; serving as a committee chair *does not* require you to also serve on the Council. It used to! The rules changed.

Our committees operate interdependently, collaborating on events and campaigns. If you have a question or an observation about something going on at SMLC, it is likely that there is a committee working on that. They'd love to hear from you! If you want to join a committee, they'd like to hear about that, too. The committee chairs are listed on our website at sanmarcoslutheran.org/about/our-team, but you can also contact the office to get the right person's name and contact information. Every committee is seeking more members all the time, so don't be shy!

This fall, a few specific committees could use your help.

The **stewardship** committee is technically an *ad hoc* committee, but it operates for several months of the year, paying attention to how the congregation's income is matching up with pledge commitments from the previous fall, and working toward the new year's stewardship campaign. Serving on this committee does not mean you have to ask people for money—especially if that scares you! The role of the stewardship committee is to communicate to the congregation how their generosity supports the mission of the church year-round, and to invite contributions of time, talent, and treasure. You'll never know who gives what—the bookkeeper handles that. If you have ideas about how to encourage everyone in our community to give what they can to sustain the work that we do, how to invite people to visit and invite visitors to stick around, or how to share your own stories of what you value about being part of SMLC, you're a great fit for the stewardship committee.

The **nominating** committee has the very specific role of spending October and November figuring out who will stand for election to the Congregation Council in December. Two members of the current council will serve alongside you. If you like chatting with everyone after worship, feel like you have a good sense of who might be a great fit for leadership, or would be willing to contact specific people and ask them about their willingness to serve, you're a great fit for the nominating committee.

The **evangelism** committee only technically exists, as nobody is currently serving on it—except Pastor Casey, who is an *ex officio* member of every committee. Experts tell us that people come to church because they have a relationship with people there, so evangelism is about ensuring that it is easy, fun, and meaningful to build relationships with people at SMLC. That looks like a lot of things, none of which include going door-to-door in our neighborhood and telling people about Jesus. Phew! But if you have ideas about keeping our campus beautiful and accessible, building relationships with the people who visit SMLC throughout the week, or engaging with things that are happening in San Marcos that need our attention and our Lutheran witness, you're a great fit for the evangelism committee.

If you have questions about these or any committees, contact Pastor Casey. And **stick around after worship on September 21 for Committee Sunday**—each committee will be represented during Community Time in Luther Hall, ready to answer your questions and tell you about the great ministry they are doing over a cup of coffee.
