There's an empty room in our house. It still has clothes in the closet, a bed that is made, and most every other indication that someone lives there, but there's an emptiness about it. Marilyn moved into her Illinois College dorm room two weeks ago, and her absence has left more than an empty room. There is such joy in seeing her establish her "space," from arranging her dorm room to attending classes. She is so incredibly ready for this step in her life with the academic challenges and social independence... but, I must admit, the rest of us aren't quite as ready. We are celebrating all the gains she is experiencing, but sometimes the loss we feel overshadows the gain.

It makes me think of that word again, a word that comes up often in the Gospel of John, a word we talked about when we started a capital campaign in 2018 for the building addition and renovation, a word we are talking about again now as we commit to a three-year stewardship appeal to pay off the mortgage incurred from that project. Abide.

We talk about it often, but what does it mean? We might ask someone, "Where do you live?" But that's not abiding. It's not about a physical location. It has a deeper connotation, a relational aspect, an enduring quality. Our home is no longer the physical location where Marilyn sleeps, eats, studies, and hangs out with us, but there is a deeper connection, a relationship that continues, even when she is away.

September 14 will be our Stewardship Commitment Sunday. What are we committing? We are NOT


committing money. If stewardship were merely a fundraiser, that would be the case. But stewardship is not, and so we are not. Stewardship is the spiritual practice where we grow in our relationship with Jesus through the use of our time, talents, and finances. It's an opportunity to grow in the trust we have for God by loosening our grasp on other things in which we put our trust. It's not a commitment that comes from our bank accounts, but from our hearts. We aren't committing something we have, we are committing ourselves to the ministry we share and to the community we so love that is the Body of Christ that we share here in this place, but extends to all people and places. We commit ourselves to abiding, to relationships with one another and with the Lord God Almighty. We abide in the faith that is not our own, but God's gift to us. We abide in the faith that is nurtured in us by the Holy Spirt. We abide in the faith that, when times are hard and we question whether we have faith at all, God keeps it for us.

As you consider your stewardship commitment, remember that we are abiding in faith for our future. We are abiding in the Alpha and Omega that we've been hearing about in Revelation, the One who is and was and always will be... and this God Almighty abides in us with faithful and enduring constancy.

Yes, there's an empty room in our house now, but, there's a relationship that transcends physical presence. May we give thanks for the relationships we have in Christ, one to another and to our Creator. May we abide in faith for our future.

Faith's Little Flock warmly welcomes—and deeply appreciates—our adult and older youth volunteers. If you're interested in spending time with the children during part of the Sunday



JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER

After a wonderful response in June, the interest in donating to the Food Center is waning, but food is needed to survive. Food Center donations for July totaled 2 pounds, and money donation was \$285. There were no food donations in August as of the 17th. Following is a description by Melissa, Food Center Director: "In July, the Food Center provided for 645 families, totaling 1,417 people. A food box is available to a family every 3 weeks. It contains shelf stable items to supplement a families grocery needs. Additionally, the Food Center provides fruit, vegetables, and other perishable items once a week to those in need."

If you are interested in volunteering at the Food Center or delivering food from Faith, they are open Monday to Friday, 311 Morgan St. Melissa writes that they are grateful for the way the Food Center meets the needs of our community. In response to feedback from our listening session, we are sharing quarterly giving snapshots throughout the year. The thermometer shows giving through June, excluding Building Fund and non-budgeted items.

Through June, we have received \$127,314 of our annual budget of \$264,796, or 48%.

In years past, we have typically received 53% of our budget by mid-year.
