Jesus referred to himself as the "Son of Man"

when referring to himself, particularly when predicting his death and resurrection. Jesus used this title to connect himself to Daniel 7, where the Son of Man approaches God's throne to receive complete authority over everything. However, Jesus emphasized that his path to the throne went through execution, burial, and resurrection. There are 4 key purposes of Jesus' death: to bring us near to God by dying for our sins, to serve as our example by correcting our selfish ways, to fulfill Scripture as God had purposed, and to establish a new movement or creation where all believers have equal standing before God.
