Sept 21 | Genesis 27:1-4, 15-23, 28:10-17

Read Genesis 27:1-4, 15-23, 28:10-17, and then spend time reflecting on the following questions:

Reflect: Jacob and Rebekah took matters into their own hands. What might it look like in your life to wait on God instead of manipulating a situation? Where have you been tempted to "help God along" instead of trusting God's timing or plan?

Jacob's deception led to separation, but later God met him in a dream. Have you ever been surprised by grace in a low moment? How have you experienced God's grace even after making a mistake or hurting someone?

Jacob saw a connection between heaven and earth.

Where have you sensed God's presence in unexpected places?

What "ladder" moments have helped you see heaven breaking into your ordinary life?

Esau's heartbreak is palpable. How might reflecting on others' pain help shape your future decisions? How do you respond when you realize the consequences of your actions affect others deeply?

Jacob's journey is full of flaws, but God still chooses him. How does this challenge or comfort you about your own story? Are you willing to believe that God can still use you—even when your path has been messy?
