Oct 19 | 1 Samuel 16:1-13; Psalm 51:1-14

Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13 and Psalm 51:1-14, and then spend time reflecting on the following questions:

Reflect: The Lord reminded Samuel that, "the Lord looks on the heart". David, a young humble shepherd, was anointed with oil—a symbol that God's Spirit was now with him. Yet even David, a man after God's heart, would later fall deeply into sin, crying out "Have mercy on me, O God" David's prayer teaches us that restoration begins not with perfection, but with honesty. God doesn't ask us to hide; but to come with open hearts.
