Read 1 Kings 19: 1-18, and then spend time reflecting on the following questions:

Reflect: Elijah expected God's presence to arrive with power in the wind, the earthquake, or the fire. Instead, God came in sheer silence. In moments of fear, loneliness, or exhaustion, we may look for big, unmistakable signs. Yet God often meets us in the stillness, speaking through quiet assurance and gentle nudges. Silence can be unsettling, but it can also be the place where God's voice becomes clearest.

When have you experienced God's presence in quiet or unexpected ways? How do you respond to silence? Does it comfort you, challenge you, or feel unfamiliar?

What might it look like to create space in your life to listen for God's

whisper this week?
