Boldness at the Beautiful Gate

Have you ever had a simple plan—a quiet walk, a short errand, a moment of prayer—only to have God completely interrupt your day?

That's what happened to Peter and John in Acts 3. They weren't setting out to perform a miracle. They weren't looking to start a movement. They were just heading to the temple for afternoon prayer.

But God had other plans.

At the Beautiful Gate, they encountered a man who had been lame from birth. He wasn't asking for healing. Just a little spare change. A few coins to make it to tomorrow. But Peter and John didn't have money—and more importantly, they didn't *need* it.

Peter looked at the man and said, "Silver and gold have I none, but what I do have I give to you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk."

And walk he did.

Actually—he leaped. He danced. He praised. He turned the temple entrance into a worship service and the prayer gathering into a praise party.

What followed was even more astonishing: a bold sermon, religious leaders in a panic, and a fledgling church praying not for safety—but for more courage.

This Sunday at MVPC, we're going to look closely at how one ordinary moment became an extraordinary movement. We'll explore how boldness isn't about having all the answers or all the resources—it's about having Jesus and the willingness to offer Him without hesitation.


Here's your challenge for the week: Where is God calling you to be bold? It might not be in front of a crowd—it might be at your kitchen table, in your workplace, or with a friend who's hurting.

Maybe someone in your life doesn't need your silver or gold. Maybe they just need your time, your prayer, your listening ear—or the reminder that Jesus sees them, loves them, and invites them to rise.

The early church believed that the name of Jesus carried power. That it still does. And when we live with that kind of boldness, the world *can't help* but take notice.

Don't miss this Sunday. The gate is still beautiful. And boldness is still contagious.

August 2025 Session Meetings Highlights

The Deacons did not meet in August but are working on projects for the fall and holidays, including the "Decluttering Strategies" event in September 23 and the annual Service of Solace scheduled for December 7.

Pastor David noted that the Nevada Presbytery will have its fall meeting September 9-10 at the Zephyr Point Conference Center, Lake Tahoe. Karla Canfield, Dian Ward, and Larua Martin are MVPC's commissioners to the Nevada Presbytery for 2025. Pledge Sunday will be November 2. The fall sermon series will focus on the Book of Acts, with the Men's and Women's Bible Studies and Sunday School concurrently studying the Book of Acts. Grace Presbyterian Church reported that the construction on its new building appears to be on schedule for completion in November. Grace continues to enjoy using MVPC's facilities for its worship services.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that training for new and returning ushers and greeters will be held on September 14. Grief Share will begin monthly meetings starting September 16. The choirs from Grace Presbyterian and MVPC will join together to present Handel's "Messiah" in December.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that Gary Wall cooked for 25 mission trip volunteers in Alaska July 30-August 9. Much is happening with organizations supported by MVPC. Family Promise will hold the grand opening ceremony for its new \$14 million Navigation Center on September 30, !0:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., with the main ceremony at 11:00 a.m. The Commission is planning a donation drive to support Project 150 in October and Project 150 will host its 14th Annual Fall Celebration on October 2. The Men's Ministry monthly Saturday breakfast raised \$960.00 in August to support the Westminster Presbyterian Church food bank. Salvation Army food donations collected on the first Sunday of August were valued at approximately \$2,500.00. MVPC collected 125 backpacks and lots of school supplies for Olive Crest, which Bob and Paula Anderson and Phil and Mari Pupanek graciously helped deliver. The Hoving Home annual gala is scheduled for October 16. Club Christ is opening a new learning center at the Lake Mead West Apartments, serving children and teens. Homeless care packs assembly will be scheduled in September. The Commission will be sponsoring an outreach event called "Protecting Our Children" on October 5, focusing on reducing gun violence. Thank you to the congregation for its generous support of so many worthwhile projects.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that the Youth Group mission trip to Loveland, Colorado July 26 through August 2 was an amazing experience for the 5 senior youth and 2 counselor volunteers. Sunday School is gearing up for a busy fall with a new study program called "Treasures" followed by studying the Book of Acts. The Young Adults group enjoyed an outing to the Pinball Hall of Fame. MVPC and Grace Presbyterian youth groups continue to enjoy joint programs.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in large and small groups) noted that a 5th Sunday brunch will be Sunday, August 31, with the last one in 2025 on November 30.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder John Meola reported on replacing the reverse osmosis system for the kitchen with a new Culligan system at a cost of approximately \$1,500.00. Elder Al Youmans reported that the solar power system will be inspected and maintenance performed, as necessary. MVPC's landscape contractor will be removing excess plants and water lines to reduce MVPC's outdoor water use.

The Truth in True Crime



Lead Me, Holy Spirit



Each new day there is more that God wants us to pray about then we can even think of in our minds. That's why He gave us His Spirit to not only lead us to pray, but also to help us pray.



















MVPC Book Club
