SUMMARY

In this sermon from the 'Church Explained'

series, the pastor explores the significance of baptism by tracing the theme of water throughout Scripture. He begins with Jesus' baptism in Matthew 3:13-17, explaining that we practice immersion baptism because the Greek word 'baptizo' means to immerse or submerge. The sermon then journeys through biblical water narratives: creation (Genesis 1), Noah's flood, the Red Sea crossing, the Jordan River crossing, and Jonah's experience - all showing how God brings new life through water.
