Navigating New Seasons (Deuteronomy 30:8-14)

Warmup: Name your favorite season and explain why it's your favorite.

READ Deuteronomy 30:8-14

- Pastor Bryan described the process of hearkening; he said the word “hearken” was too BIG for “obey.” How does one “hearken” the voice of God?

READ Numbers 14:20-24

- In this passage of Scripture what are the actions and attitudes of those who do not “hearken”?
- Why will Caleb enter the land of promise?

REFLECTION Joshua 3:9-17 (The Israelites crossing the Jordan River)

- What fears might the Israelites have felt standing before the Jordan? How do you relate to those fears in your own life?
- What role does obedience play in experiencing God's miracles? How have you seen this in your own walk?
- Who is leading the people across the Jordan River (v. 11)?
- What steps of faith do the priests take to make way for the people's safe passage through the waters?
- How do the actions of the leaders and the people reflect God's heart for His Church and specifically for Covenant Grove?

RESPOND

- Divide into groups of 3. In a 3-minute brainstorming session, identify possible “names” for the new season Covenant Grove has entered.
- From the passages you've read, what actions accompany this season of _____ (identified name for the season) or in CG words: prayer-led, faith-filled, big-thinking, risk-takers?
- Take turns sharing how Joshua 3:9–17 connects to your personal journey.
 - Where do you sense God inviting you to trust Him more deeply?
